The clear distinction in the colours of the trees tells a rather obvious fact, autumn

Last Sunday after Samuels's baptism at Egerton URC, some of us us that the season of Pentecost is even sat outside to bask in the sunshine and enjoyed well roasted lamb chops and a wide assortment of Kenyan cuisine...a proper Indian summer it was. But if the trees are a dead giveaway of the things to come, so is one hymn which has been sung up and down the whole country in most protestant churches this last few weeks... So, as we congratulate ourselves for the good harvest and drink countless pints and classes of wine, or even eat several tomatoes on one Thursday morning sitting...yes you know yourself!, harvest time is also a time to give thanks to the ever -creating God who is at work when and how we know not. Harvest also reminds nearly over, and in a couple of weeks we shall begin the season of advent. We come into this season and begin a new liturgical year in the Church. Advent is not my favourite time of the year because I hate waiting. Never the less, it's a great season that embodies and expresses the hope that is central to our lives as Christians. This hope is the primary focus for us and indeed the entire earth full of conflict, pain and suffering.

And it's this sense of chaos and suffering that has put most people off

religion in the secular world. People see fellow human beings suffering and often ask the question: How can a just God allow innocent suffering? There are no simple answers to such questions, yet as people of faith we continue to hold faith in Gods promises found in the words of prophet Jeremiah: See the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks when I am going to fulfil the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah." The promise is that: "Judah shall be saved and Israel shall dwell in confidence.

As modern followers of our Lord, we are those who live in faith of God's promises, who dwell in confidence even though that sometimes sounds like simple Christian fantasy. In these days of congregational haemorrhage, economic hardships, terrorist attacks, wars and rumours of war. it's difficult to see the future of the church. But advent is coming and it brings a hope. So, we wait in hope, waiting for the saviour of the world. Not to come and eradicate all our problems, but to walk with us and help us to live as the children of Gods promise... A very happy Advent and Christmas full of blessings: Rev G.

T.R.I.O. SERVICE (THE RESPONSIBILITY IS OURS)

On Sunday, 24th November I led worship, the theme of which was belonging, caring and sharing. As Treasurer of Bank Top URC, it's my responsibility to make sure that our expenditure doesn't exceed our income, and during the service I attempted to explain a little bit about our finance. We are in a comfortable position at Bank Top as we do have money in the bank and this is mainly because our church is let out to various organisations during the week (see above) and the rent from these lettings keeps us in the black!

Our Offerings only just cover the amount we have to pay to the Synod for Ministry and Mission and this doesn't include the rest of our bills - gas, electricity, water, telephone, Sunday School costs (including rental of the portacabin), pulpit supply, printing, insurance etc, etc.

So... we can't afford to become complacent! We need to consider at this time of year whether or not we could increase our offerings from January 2014. We need also to consider whether we wish to change the way we give to maybe Envelopes or Standing Orders; and if we pay Income Tax, think about signing a Gift Aid Claim form so that tax can be reclaimed on the contributions we make.

Everyone should have by now received an envelope containing leaflets explaining about proportionate giving and about how we give. We need you to complete the Response Form and return it to church by Sunday, 8^{th} December.

Remember what you give is a matter between you and God and it remains strictly confidential. We are not asking you to give more than you can afford - only that you give it some thought!




