Friends: Faith Football FAITH & FOOTBALL

When it comes to football, I think I am an idealist perhaps even a wee bit naive. I had dared to dream that the English team would progress further than they did; quarter finals perhaps! Good thing I am not a betting man. But I have to say, at the risk of offending die hard England supporters that the National team is too mediocre: seems to me that as soon as a player is able to do a Keepie uppie he's made it to the league table and the national team. The result of course is that we have too many overpaid mediocre players who have no incentive to put effort in because they still get paid mega sums no matter what. There is no great desire to excel beyond the mediocrity. It would be worthwhile to remember every now and then that England invented this beautiful game more than 150 years ago and gave it to the world as a gift: now we are uncompetitive and our national team will be coming home early in disgrace. Compare our overpaid actors/ players with the young lads from countries like Argentina, Uruguay or Brazil and the difference becomes obvious. Those kids are hun-

gry...hungry for success. They have an acute need to excel beyond mediocrity...they want it so bad, you can sense it just by watching them play. England's dismal performance in Brazil however, reminds me of our modern Christian life. We too have become so complacent in the secular world and have abandoned the agenda for Heaven which is our final destination. Like England footballers, we happily embrace mediocrity and we are satisfied to let the secular world win as long as we continue receiving our exaggerated weekly pay cheques. It seems there is no huge desire among many Christians to lead an exemplary life that stands apart from the rest of the society.

As spring gave way to the summer months and ushered the season of Pentecost. we have yet another reminder of the hand of God in our lives, as the green leaves of the trees, flowers, shrubs and hedges cover our hitherto naked landscape. This new life should also be present in our faith as the result of the activity of the Holy Spirit which has guided Christians throughout church history. Without Pentecost, the Christ event would have remained imprisoned in history. Pentecost is the season of empowering. The disciples were called to live in Christ's Spirit and do His works. We too are

called to do so today and not settle for mediocrity but strive to excel everyday as if our lives depended on it. The experience of Pentecost is one of unity and joy that transcends denomination, economic, racial and linguistic differences and is an expression of God's universal love.

When the Spirit descended upon the scared disciples in the upper room, their fear was replaced by boldness and their cynicism by confidence. Equally we must ask the Spirit for that same boldness and confidence as we do mission and ministry in and around the communities where we live and as we reach out in the joy of the risen Christ not only to those already practicing their faith, but also to those who are away from the Church or have never met Christ. We must be prepared to play extra time even in the heat of our own Manaus to win the trophy for Christ: we dare not lose. My prayers that together with the England team we can embrace this Pentecost Sprit and harness its force for good and goals.....Enjoy your summer whatever the weather:


Dear Friends
