Psalm 137.

A message from our Missional Partnership Minister . . .

Dear all,

As I write, we're waiting to hear formally that the Covid restrictions in England are to be lifted on 19th July. This has been labelled 'freedom day' by the press and many others. The URC moderators have responded by issuing some guidance which they have entitled 'new freedoms, same responsibilities.' This takes us right back to the beginning of Genesis, reminding us that God made us to be stewards of creation. (Genesis 1: 26-31) In Genesis we see that God has given us an amazing world in which to live and showered us with good gifts. We are told that everything we have and are comes from God, who delights in us enjoying them all.

However, these gifts have not been given to us simply for our own use. They have been given for the benefit of the whole of creation. In the same way, the freedoms which we have are not solely for our own benefit, but also for the benefit of others. This is why we're being asked to consider carefully how we use our new freedoms and whether we need to practice some restraint for the benefit of others.

Consequently, we will need to carry on considering each step carefully as we open up. Common sense and sanitiser will continue to be the order of the day. I nearly said for some time, but given that the rate of other infections, including colds and flu, have greatly decreased due to the Covid precautions, maybe we should make some changes permanent.

Surely extra consideration for other people should be one of the permanent changes. I do not wear a mask for my own benefit, but for the benefit of others. I'm not suggesting that we should continue to wear masks everywhere that we have done, but on a crowded train or bus, they would definitely reduce infection. As would folk who remain at home, if they have an infection, instead of going out and passing it on.

The other area that we may want to think twice about is physical contact with other people. The pandemic has made many of us realise how important touch is. I hope we will soon feel able to exchange handshakes or even hugs and simply to hold hands appropriately. However, we will need to be really careful to ensure that the person we are connecting with really wants that connection.

It's going to be more important than ever that we ask permission before hugging or touching anyone and we should also ask if folk are comfortable to shake hands yet. We mustn't be offended if they sanitise their hands after doing so either.


Nevertheless, like many of you, I'm looking forward to singing and to sharing coffee safely after the service. We have missed a lot in the last 15 months, and we will soon be able to get back to some of the things that we have missed. Let's continue to be careful though and remember that there will always be others who need extra consideration, whether they are immunosuppressed or anxious, neither of which will necessarily be obvious.

So, let's praise God in song and in action, by continuing to take care of and for those around us, so that God's image may shine forth in each.

I would like to thank everyone for their continued support during the lockdown. It has been a very difficult time for you all and your generosity is very much appreciated.

In June we donated £570 to Christian Aid; please see letter of thanks from Christian Aid on our noticeboard, which details where the money is being spent

We received donations to our Memorial Account of £100 in February, and two amounts of £500 and £5,000 in July.

We have also received a sum of £5,000 from the Insurance for lost income during lockdown. This amount relates to lost income up to February of this year. We will be putting in another claim shortly for the period March to July.

After speaking to Daleen, who ran the Eco workshop, we were advised to re-visit some of these boxes to see if we could answer some of these in a more positive way. With people taking holidays, I suspect that we won't get back on it before September now, but we remain positive, and with the current freak weather we are experiencing around the world; from floods, to heatwaves to forest fires, it feels even more important to make sure that we are all doing our best to reduce climate change, in whatever way we can and this is where you come in, because it isn't just about our church building, it's also about our individual members and what each one of us is doing about becoming Eco-Friendly.
