"And you might have heard of the story of the small gate in Jerusalem called the eye of the needle, which camels needed to kneel and shed their load to enter. The lesson there is that it *is* possible for the 'camel' to go through the 'eye of the needle', though quite difficult. **But no such gate exists; Jesus says it is impossible** (verse 27).

The reason for this is not simply that wealth creates an issue—though it does. It is because of the nature of the kingdom. The very premise of the man's question ('What must *I do* to inherit...') is flawed. We cannot do anything to merit this; it comes as pure gift."

A pure gift – we would do well to remember this.

BANANA BREAD

8oz Self Raising Flour
4oz Butter/Marg
3oz Raisins
3 Tblsp of Semi Skinned Milk
½ Tsp Vanilla essence

pinch of salt. 6oz Dark Brown Sugar 1 Egg 2 Ripe Bananas – mashed. To glaze 1 Tblsp Honey warmed

to graze 1 Torsp Honey warmed

Pre heat oven 180 Gas 4. You will need a 2lb loaf tin greased Rub the flour, salt and butter until it resembles breadcrumbs. Add the sugar and raisins, mix well.

Mix together milk, bananas, egg and* vanilla essence, until a dropping mixture. Add to the flour mixture and mix together. Spoon into the greased tin. Bake for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours – until golden colour. Leave to cool and then pour over cake

*Add 1tsp mixed spice and leave out the vanilla essence

CHICKEN AND CHORIZO BEAN STEW (SERVES 4)

25ml oil Salt & Pepper 1 Large Onion diced 1 Tin Tomatoes 1 Can Cannelini Beans 8 Chicken Thighs200gms Chorizo sliced4 Cloves Garlic crushed1 Small bunch of fresh Basil

In a large frying pan, fry the chicken on both sides until golden. Add all the other ingredients. Bring to the boil and simmer gently for 20 minutes.


